Here we go again with another bowling season. By now most of you have been bowling for quite a few weeks, others are just getting back in the swing of things. I hope everyone has a spectacular season. If you haven't already received your sanction card, it should be coming real soon. Remember, your sanction card will be sent directly to you in the mail from the United States Bowling Congress (USBC).

AVERAGE NOT ON SANCTION CARD

When you receive your 2007-08 USBC Sanction Card you will notice that your 2006-07 average is not printed on the card. The USBC is not able to print your highest average on your card. In many cases the listed average was not necessarily the appropriate average for tournaments. Averages can be viewed and printed by checking your records on www.bowl.com using the "Find a Member" feature. In addition to average records, the "Find a Member" feature also includes awards information and membership history. The average data on bowl.com is more completed and accurate. It

should show all of your averages and the number of games bowled in each of the leagues you bowl. However, if you believe the information is not correct, contact your league secretary to have it corrected. If you do not have access to bowl.com, the 2006-07 GCBA Average Books are in the bowling centers. Please make sure your average is correct.

BOWLING IS A SPORT

The following is a special message from the USBC President, Jeff Boje. USBC's vision is to grow the sport of bowling, but what does that mean. It doesn't mean we want to make all of our members 200 average bowlers or make everyone a Sport Bowling member. We want more people to engage in bowling – and to view bowling – as a competitive activity. It's a disturbing reality that 22 percent of the American population considers bowling to be a sport while the rest view it as "entertainment."

USBC wants people to go to the bowling center not merely to have lunch, chat with friends and toss a ball down the lane, but to participate in bowling like they would soccer, softball or any other sport. Bowling must not allow itself to be perceived as a rainy-day alternative to the movies. Our future depends on parents and kids viewing bowling as an alternative to Little League baseball or soccer.

Bowling as entertainment is a good, thriving business for proprietors. It helps them maintain their facilities, pays for renovations and improvements and makes a center more attractive to all customers. It's a great way to introduce people to bowling. But bowling for entertainment is not the function of the USBC.

Our need is to focus on getting people to engage in bowling as a competition. If you bowl because you value the outcome of the game, compete against the other team with a desire to win, care whether the rules are followed and the specifications that define the sport are uniform, then you value bowling as a sport.

USBC's mission also remains the same. We will continue to serve the leagues and associations that are the engine that drives USBC. We understand it's our role to service those entities and to be there for them so they can support us. Our mission has not changed one bit.

USBC CHANGES AWARDS PROGRAM

Keeping in line with its vision to grow the sport of bowling, USBC believes there's a difference between recognizing an accomplishment and rewarding an achievement. It's a shift in focus USBC applied to its youth awards program more than a year ago, and it's now being applied to USBC's adult members in selected awards categories.

Starting August 1, USBC members who roll games at least 100 pins over their averages will emblems in recognition receive the accomplishment while those who bowl 298 and 299 games will earn 11 strikes-in-a-row plaques.

Those who roll a 298 or 299 games and want another form of recognition (such as a ring) will be able to purchase them through USBC. The Century Watch for bowling 100 pins over your average will no longer be available. USBC also is considering additional purchasable options for 298 or 299 bowlers.

This change is the first step in the transition from a reward-based philosophy to one of appropriate recognition. According to former USBC Chief Executive Officer Roger Dalkin, "for too long the organization and its predecessors rewarded achievements rather than recognizing the accomplishment."

USBC also is discontinuing league high game and high average pins because most leagues already offer their own high game/high series awards.

GCBA HIGH AVERAGE AND SERIES

Congratulations to Chris Federer for having the highest average in the GCBA during the 2006-07 season, and Derrick Beard for bowling the highest series in the GCBA during the 2006-07 season. Chris averaged 229 in the Friday Night Mens League at Poplar Junction Lanes. Derrick bowled an extraordinary 840 series in the Wednesday Night Mens League at Salem Bowl.

GCBA HALL OF FAME

The GCBA will hold their First Hall of Fame Banquet and 2006-2007 Awards Program at Michael's Restaurant - 415 Broadway - in Highland on Saturday, October 27, 2007. The Program is open to the public. GCBA SENIOR SCRATCH CLASSIC

The GCBA Senior Scratch Classic will be held Sunday, November 4, 2007 at Bartelso KC Lanes in Bartelso. This is a one day tournament beginning at Noon, and is open to all GCBA members who are at least 50 years old as of November 4, 2007. The format is the same as last year's tournament allowing the bowlers to compete with bowlers in their age bracket. The tournament will be divided into two divisions – bowlers between the ages of 50 and 59, and bowlers 60 years of age and older. Each bowler will bowl four games - rotating one pair of lanes to the right after each game. After the four games, the top four bowlers in each division will bowl "bracket style" within their division. The top qualifier will bowl the fourth qualifier and the second qualifier will bowl the third qualifier with the winners bowling each other to determine the winner of their division. The winner of each division will bowl each other to determine the overall GCBA Senior Scratch Champion.

There will be one shift at Noon, and it is limited to 30 bowlers. The entry fee is \$50.00 and must accompany your entry blank to assure your spot. The estimated first place prize is \$500.00 based on 30 entries. Advanced registration by phone is recommended and available by calling Tim Rutz at 654-9840. We must have at least 20 bowlers signed up by November 1, 2007 or the event will be cancelled. Complete rules along with the entry blanks are available at each bowling center.

GCBA SINGLES SCRATCH CLASSIC

The GCBA Singles Scratch Classic will be held at Ten Pin Bowl in Carlyle on Sunday, December 2, 2007 at Noon. This is a one day tournament open to all GCBA members. The format is the same as last year. Each bowler will roll five games - rotating one pair of lanes to the right after each game. After the five games, the top five bowlers will bowl "TV STYLE" to determine the GCBA Scratch Champion. There will be one shift at Noon, and it is limited to 60 bowlers. The entry fee is \$50.00 and must accompany your entry blank to assure vour spot. The estimated first place prize is \$500.00 based on 30 entries. Advanced registration by phone is recommended and available by calling Tim Rutz at 654-9840. We must have at least 20 bowlers signed up by November 26, 2007 or the event will be cancelled. Complete rules along with the entry blanks are available at each bowling center.

GCBA HANDICAP TOURNAMENT

The 66th Annual GCBA Handicap Team Tournament will be held at V&H Recreation in Breese. It will begin Saturday, February 23, 2008 and will run through Sunday, April 6, 2008. Squad times will be at 4:00 PM and 8:00 PM on Saturdays. There will be one squad at Noon on Sundays. Due to prior commitments, there will be no bowling on February 23rd at 8:00 PM and both shifts on March 22nd. There will also be no bowling on Easter Sunday, March 23rd.

The Singles and Doubles Events will be held at Salem Bowl in Salem. It will begin on Saturday, February 23, 2008 and run through Sunday, March 30, 2008. Squad times will be at 4:00 PM and 8:00 PM on Saturdays. There will be one squad at Noon on Sundays. There will be no bowling at 8:00 PM on February 23, and there will be no bowling on Easter Sunday March 23rd.

Again this year, there will be an optional Singles Scratch Event, an optional Doubles Scratch Event, and an optional Team Scratch Event.

Multiple Singles and Doubles

Again this year you will have the opportunity to bowl singles and doubles as often as you desire during the GCBA Handicap Tournament. However, unlike last year you must bowl both singles and doubles. Please keep in mind that you can cash only once in singles no matter how many times you bowl the singles event. Your highest singles score will count in the standings and the score from the first time you bowl singles will count towards your all events score. On the other hand, in doubles you can cash as many times as you enter with different partners. The score from the first time you bowl doubles will count towards your all events score.

Entering Tournament Average

Again this year, bowlers will use their <u>highest</u> <u>USBC</u> <u>sanctioned league average</u> – with a minimum of 21 games – from the 2006-07 season. You can find your highest USBC average at <u>www.bowl.com</u> by clicking on Find a Member on the left side column, fill out your information, click on search, and then click on 2006-07. If you are a new bowler or did not have a 21 game average last season, you must use your highest USBC sanctioned league average as of JANUARY 1, 2008. All others bowl scratch. You can also find

your GCBA average in the 2006-07 GCBA Average Book. Each bowling center has an average book. Please check your average and make sure it is correct.

Entry blanks will be in the bowling centers after November 18th.
