#### **EDDIE GREER WINS SENIOR CLASSIC**

The GCBA Senior Scratch Classic was held November 5, 2006 at Mascoutah Community Lanes in Mascoutah. The tournament was divided into two divisions – those between the ages of 50 & 59 and those 60 years of age and older. Twenty-two (22) bowlers competed in the tournament, so the format was modified and the top three qualifiers in each division bowled match play to determine the division winners. In the 50-59 age division, the top three qualifiers with their four game totals were: (1) Charlie Kunkel 970 including a 300 game; (2) Bill Gass 874; and (3) Eddie Greer 850. In the match play, top qualifier Charlie Kunkel received a bye. The number three seed, Eddie Greer, defeated the number two seed, Bill Gass, 236-207. Eddie Greer then defeated Charlie Kunkel 212-190 to win the division

In the 60 years of age and older division, the top three qualifiers with their four game totals were: (1) **Willie Hettenhausen** 852; (2) **Tom Whalen** 842; and (3) **Art Bowker** 840. In the match play, top qualifier **Willie Hettenhausen** received a bye. The number two seed, **Tom Whalen**, defeated the number three seed, **Art Bowker**, 217-198. **Willie Hettenhausen** then defeated **Tom Whalen** 237-181 to win the division. In the championship match, Eddie Greer defeated Willie Hettenhausen 205-189 to become the overall Greater Carlyle Bowling Association Senior Scratch Champion. CONGRATULATIONS EDDIE.

#### JOHN HELIGE WINS SCRATCH CLASSIC

For the second time in four years, John Helige won the GCBA Scratch Classic. Thirty-five (35) bowlers competed in the tournament on December 3, 2006 at Vandalia Bowl in Vandalia. The top five qualifiers with their five game totals were: (1) Jason Timmermann 1089; (2) Ken Monken 1075; (3) Jared Lutz 1031; (4) John Helige & Barry Missey 1008. The top five qualifiers competed in a "TV STYLE" stepladder finals. In the first match, John Helige defeated Barry Missey 169-166. In the second match, John Helige defeated Jared Lutz 213-190. In the third match, John Helige defeated Ken Monken 202-169. And in the final match, John Helige defeated Jason Timmermann 40-28 in a ninth and tenth frame roll off after they tied with a score of 157 to become the Greater Carlyle Bowling Association Scratch Classic Champion.
